- 23/24 /5 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AND CONSIDERATION OF ANY DISPENSATIONS REQUIRED** Cllr Pople declared an interest in the Play Area as she is the Council's representative on the committee. Cllr Thompson declared an interest in the CVA as his wife is the Treasurer and he is the Publication Officer.
- 23/24 /6 MANOR FARM DEVELOPMENT An update is currently due at the June meeting at 6.30pm.
- 23/24 /7 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING were confirmed and signed.
- 23/24 /8 UPDATES ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS AND NOT LISTED none.
- 23/24 /9 **SOMERSET COUNCILLORS' REPORTS** neither Somerset Councillor was present. However Tessa Munt, Somerset Councillor, was present and there was some discussion of the new arrangements at Somerset Council and the Local Community Networks.

## 23/24 /10 HIGHWAYS: -

- a. <u>Updates</u>
  - i. <u>Little Leaze Lane</u> Both Cllr Salter and the Clerk had reported this again. Cllr Salter would continue to report it via the online procedure.
  - ii. Sunken repair in Manor Road Clerk to chase this up.
  - iii. <u>Damaged verge</u> Some stones had been put round here but nobody knew who was responsible.
- b. Problems arising and other highway matters
  - i. <u>Flooding near Old Post Office</u> this had occurred again. Unfortunately by the time the Clerk gets notified of this it is and is able to pass it on always too late for Mr Gill to visit to look at the problem.
  - ii. <u>Slippery pavements</u> It was reported that the pavements near the school were slippery in icy weather. In the past they have had bags of salt for spreading in such conditions. It was agreed that when Highways are distributing salt there should be some left inside the wall of the School car park where it used to be kept for them.
  - iii. <u>Stones on edge of highway along Lippetts Way</u> the Clerk would write to the householders to let them know of the dangers of such obstructions and the ongoing consequences.
